### Trinity Carnival & Installation of TVs in Learning Spaces

## PRAYING WITH YOUR CHILDREN

If we want our children to know God and not just know about Him, we need to teach them to pray and pray with them.

Prayer is simply a conversation with God.

God gave us prayer so we could communicate with him directly, and become aware of his presence around us in our lives. By praying with our children we are helping them to understand that God is always close and accessible, and attentive to whatever we have to say. God is always willing to listen no matter where we are or what the time of day.

There are lots of ways you can help your children to pray. One way is by inviting them to assist you in setting up a sacred space that may contain a bible, prayer book, candle or cross etc. Then begin by leading the children in praying the Sign of the Cross and reflecting on things that really matter to your family.

Sometimes a sentence starter may be used, such as:

"God, I thank you for ..."

"God, forgive me for ..."

"God, help my friend ..."

"God, help me be more ..."

"God, help me to let go of ..."

"God, give me the courage to ..."

"God, one of the fears I need help with is" ...

This can help your child become at ease with the conversation they are having with God. As they get older, traditional Church prayers may be introduced and children can move between saying these prayers and offering up their own intentions. Children will also begin to pray wherever they feel comfortable.

# Seasons for Growth at Trinity

Seasons for Growth is a program for children, young people or adults who have experienced significant change or loss. It is based on the belief that change, loss and grief are a normal and valuable part of life.

Seasons for Growth is a small group loss and grief education program. The Children and Young People's Program strengthens the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people who are dealing with significant loss or change. This may include the death of a loved one, parental divorce or separation, the experience and aftermath of natural disaster, illness, moving house or school, as well as many other life changes and losses.

Small groups of 4-7 children work with a trained adult Companion (facilitator) who supports the children in learning new ways to share, think about and respond to the changes and losses in their lives. Children learn that they are not alone in dealing with the effects of change, loss and grief. They build their understanding and communication, decision making and problem solving skills as part of a supportive peer group.

The program takes place over a structured eight-week period filled with peer-to-peer learning opportunities - with time to talk and listen as well as take part in activities including drawing, music, art, journaling, role-plays and storytelling.

At Trinity, we will be offering this program for students in **Years 1 – 6** during Terms 3 and Term 4. It is recommended that students participate in Seasons from between 6-12 months after the experience of loss or depending on the family circumstances. If you believe this program would benefit your child/ren and you would like them to participate in the program, could you please send me an email containing their name and class, as well as outlining the change that has occurred within your family so I have some background knowledge when working with them.

## Login to the Trinity Catholic Primary School Parent Portal



At the end of last year and at the beginning of this year we held parent information sessions explaining the Hapara Trinity Parent Portal. The Hapara Trinity Parent Portal is open to parents to view their child's learning from the Victorian Curriculum Learning Areas and the Diocese of Sale Religious Education Curriculum *'To Live in Christ Jesus'*.

Student learning samples are progressively saved in Hapara student learning files over the course of each Semester. Therefore, the portal allows parents real-time access to view your child's learning journey throughout the course of each term and throughout the year. By the end of Semester One, evidence of student learning will be viewed in conjunction with your child's Semester Report and their Digital Portfolio.

Each child received unique login details in Term One which provided parent access to student learning samples in the parent portal. We ask that you log into the parent portal to ensure that you have access and are able to view your child's learning samples. Logging in via a computer / laptop is recommended prior to a mobile device. The Hapara Trinity Parent Portal can be accessed through the Trinity school website.

### TRINITY CAR PARK ETIQUETTE

- For greater safety and visibility, we are requesting that all drivers **reverse** park into the marked bays.
- Thank you all who use the pedestrian crossing area. You are demonstrating to your children correct road safety practices. Once children cross the pedestrian crossing into the parking area, they, for their safety, need to be placed into vehicles promptly. The car park is **NOT** a meeting area.
- The lane around the edge of the car park (closest to the oval) are for vehicles waiting to pick children up from the Pick-up Zone **ONLY**.
- The two parking bays closest to the office path are the **PICK-UP ZONES**. These are **NO STANDING** zones. If your children are not ready to get into your car as you pull up to the pick-up zone, you must continue on and rejoin the end of the pick-up queue.
- There is **NO RIGHT TURN** when exiting the car park. All vehicles must turn left for the safety of others and to maintain traffic flow.
- **THE GATES CLOSE AT 9.00am AND RE-OPEN AT 3.00pm**. Occasionally they might reopen slightly later due to school activities.
- The Staff Car Park is for **STAFF PARKING ONLY**. Please do not use as a drop off/pick up for students.

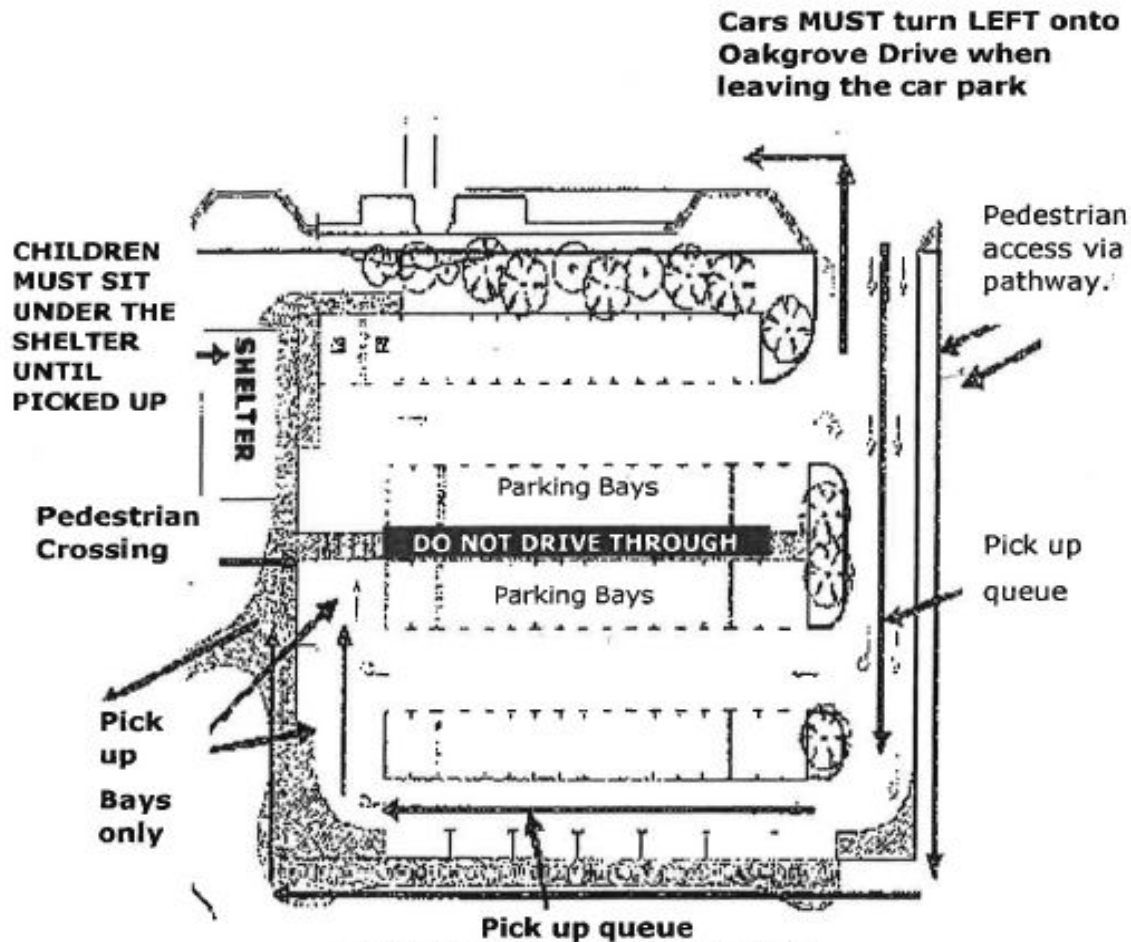
